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)	STANDING ORDER
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The United States Attorney has submitted on behalf of the United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, a proposed bond and forfeiture schedule to be applicable to lands administered by the United States Forest Service in the State of North Dakota. The Court has reviewed the proposed schedule and finds it is within a range of comparable schedules approved for other agencies for comparable offenses.

**IT IS ORDERED** that the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule of the Forest Service as set out in Exhibit 1, which is made part of this Order, is hereby adopted, effective the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Collateral Forfeiture Schedule supersedes any and all previous Collateral Forfeiture Schedules adopted in the District of North Dakota for petty offenses under the jurisdiction of the United States Forest Service.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this Order be made a part of the record of standing orders of this Court and of the Central Violations Bureau pertaining to the clerical, administrative, and fiscal operations it maintains on behalf of this District.

NOTE

In the presence of aggravated circumstances, i.e. where the result of a person's actions exceeds the bond, when it can be shown that the person had been fully informed of the prohibition prior to the violation or when a serious threat exists to forest property, resources or personnel, an enhanced bond forfeiture of up to \$1000 may be established on any violation of preceding Subpart A or B Prohibitions. Special Agent or Patrol Captain approval is required for enhancing bond on a Notice of Violation, form FS-5300-4. An analysis of the violation and circumstances, including recidivism, must be conducted prior to the issuance of any Notice of Violation with enhanced bond. Justification, including name of authorizing Officer or Agent must be included in the probable cause statement on such Notice of Violation, form FS-5300-4. Inappropriate demeanor by itself will not necessarily constitute aggravated circumstances. Mandatory Appearances: may only be required after consultation with and approval of a Patrol Captain, Special Agent, or an Assistant U.S. Attorney.
