Whereas a recent escalation in cyberattacks on the CM/ECF systems of federal courts requires new procedures for the storage and management of sealed documents; **It is hereby ordered** that, effective as of the date of this Order.

1. Filing Sealed Documents.

Sealed documents will continue to be filed in CM/ECF under existing procedures but will not be accessible or viewable to the parties by electronic means.

2. Electronic Access to Sealed Documents.

Sealed documents will continue to be filed in CM/ECF under existing procedures, but they will not be accessible or viewable to the parties by electronic means. Although parties will receive Notices of Electronic Filing when such documents are filed in their cases, the documents themselves will not be accessible or viewable electronically. *Note: CM/ECF automatically restricts certain documents in Social Security and civil immigration cases. These documents will remain accessible and viewable to the parties by electronic means.*

3. Service of Sealed Documents Filed in CM/ECF.

- a. Because sealed documents filed in CM/ECF are no longer accessible or viewable electronically, service of those documents cannot be accomplished through CM/ECF. Therefore, parties must serve all sealed documents by other appropriate means as provided by the Federal Rules of Procedure.
- b. Except for certain documents served on North Dakota's U.S. Attorney's Office and Federal Public Defender's Office, the Clerk's Office will serve sealed court-issued documents in paper by mail.
- **4. Highly Sensitive Documents (HSDs).** Sealed documents that are defined as HSDs will continue to be subject to the court's HSD procedures set forth in the <u>Standing Order</u> re: <u>Procedures for the Filing, Service, and Management of Highly Sensitive Documents, dated February 16, 2021.</u>

5. Questions about Sealed Document Procedures. Any questions about the filing of and access to sealed documents should be directed to the Clerk's Office at ndd clerksoffice@ndd.uscourts.gov.

This Order supersedes any inconsistent prior court orders, local rules, and the Administrative Policy Governing Electronic Filing and Service.
