GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. You are responsible for complying with the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and the Local Rules of Court. Legal research sources are listed on the following page.
- 2. Employees of the court are not permitted to give you legal advice. Legal Aid and attorney referral services are listed on the following page.
- 3. You are responsible for paying court fees: \$405 for filing a civil action; \$605 for filing an appeal; \$.50 per page for copying.
- 4. All communications to the court should be in writing and directed to the Clerk of Court at an address listed above. You should not directly contact a Judge or chamber's staff.
- 5. Before filing a civil action, consider the consequences of losing or filing a frivolous lawsuit. Under limited circumstances the court may order that the losing party pay the attorney's fees and costs incurred by the winning party to defend a civil action.

TO FILE A COMPLAINT

- 1. Review the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Local Rules of Court.
- 2. Complete an original signed complaint and file it with the Clerk. Clearly mark whether a jury trial is demanded.
- 3. Complete a cover sheet (Form JS-44) and attach it to the complaint.
- 4. Send the filing fee or complete an Application to Proceed Without Prepayment of Fees and file it with the Clerk.
- 5. The Clerk will issue a Summons, Notice of Lawsuit/Request for Waiver of Service (Form AO-398), and Waiver of Service of Summons (Form AO-399) for each defendant. See Rule 4(d) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

SERVICE OF SUMMONS AND COMPLAINT

- 1. Review Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Rule 4.1 of the District of North Dakota's Civil Local Rules. For service upon the United States of America, Review Rule 4 (i) of Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 2. File the original summons with return of service with the Clerk.
- 3. File the return receipt (green card) and a Certificate of Service with the Clerk, if service by certified mail.

TERMS YOU MAY ENCOUNTER WHEN FILING A CIVIL ACTION (See Black's Law Dictionary for additional terms)

Amendment	Correction of an error in any pleading or legal document.
Answer	Formal written statement made by a defendant in the civil action which answers each allegation contained in the complaint.
Certificate of Service	Document evidencing delivery of a legal document to a party.
Civil action	Every lawsuit other than a criminal action; an action brought by a party to enforce or protect a private right.
Complaint	Legal document that begins a civil action. It states the facts and identifies the action the court is asked to take.
Costs	Expense of prosecuting or defending a civil action, other than attorneys fees.
Defendant	Person defending a civil action.
Dismissal	Termination of a civil action, either with or without prejudice.
Diversity of Citizenship	Condition when the party of one side of civil action is a citizen of one state and the other party is a citizen of another state; may be basis for federal court jurisdiction if dollar amount in controversy is met (\$75,000).
Federal Question	Legal issue involving the interpretation and application of the U.S. Constitution, an act of Congress, or a treaty; may be basis for federal court jurisdiction.
Federal Rules of Civil Procedure	Rules governing civil actions in federal courts. Abbreviated as Fed. R. Civ. P. or FRCP. The appendix to the Rules contains many sample forms.
Federal Rules of Evidence	Rules governing the admissibility of evidence at trials in federal courts. Abbreviated as Fed. R. Evid. or FRE.
In Forma Pauperis	Permission given by the court to a person to sue without prepayment of fees. Abbreviated as IFP.
Jurisdiction	Power or authority of the Court to hear and decide a case.
Jury Trial Demand	Formal request to the court for a trial by jury; right to jury trial may be waived if demand not made promptly.
Local Rules	Rules of procedure for U.S. District Court, North Dakota.
Parties	Persons or entities who prosecute or defend a civil action.
Plaintiff	Person prosecuting a civil action.
Pro Se	Prosecuting or defending a civil action without the assistance of an attorney.
Service of process	Delivery of legal documents to a party to furnish reasonable notice of proceedings and afford opportunity to appear and be heard.
Summons	Document notifying defendant that a civil action has begun and that defendant is required to appear and answer the complaint.
United States Code	Federal statutory law published as multi-volume code. Abbreviated as U.S.C.
Venue	Geographical location where a civil action is tried.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ATTORNEYS COMPLETING CIVIL COVER SHEET FORM JS 44

Authority For Civil Cover Sheet

The JS 44 civil cover sheet and the information contained herein neither replaces nor supplements the filings and service of pleading or other papers as required by law, except as provided by local rules of court. This form, approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States in September 1974, is required for the use of the Clerk of Court for the purpose of initiating the civil docket sheet. Consequently, a civil cover sheet is submitted to the Clerk of Court for each civil complaint filed. The attorney filing a case should complete the form as follows:

- **I.(a) Plaintiffs-Defendants.** Enter names (last, first, middle initial) of plaintiff and defendant. If the plaintiff or defendant is a government agency, use only the full name or standard abbreviations. If the plaintiff or defendant is an official within a government agency, identify first the agency and then the official, giving both name and title.
- (b) County of Residence. For each civil case filed, except U.S. plaintiff cases, enter the name of the county where the first listed plaintiff resides at the time of filing. In U.S. plaintiff cases, enter the name of the county in which the first listed defendant resides at the time of filing. (NOTE: In land condemnation cases, the county of residence of the "defendant" is the location of the tract of land involved.)
- (c) Attorneys. Enter the firm name, address, telephone number, and attorney of record. If there are several attorneys, list them on an attachment, noting in this section "(see attachment)".

II. Jurisdiction. The basis of jurisdiction is set forth under Rule 8(a), F.R.Cv.P., which requires that jurisdictions be shown in pleadings. Place an "X" in one of the boxes. If there is more than one basis of jurisdiction, precedence is given in the order shown below. United States plaintiff. (1) Jurisdiction based on 28 U.S.C. 1345 and 1348. Suits by agencies and officers of the United States are included here. United States defendant. (2) When the plaintiff is suing the United States, its officers or agencies, place an "X" in this box.

Federal question. (3) This refers to suits under 28 U.S.C. 1331, where jurisdiction arises under the Constitution of the United States, an amendment to the Constitution, an act of Congress or a treaty of the United States. In cases where the U.S. is a party, the U.S. plaintiff or defendant code takes precedence, and box 1 or 2 should be marked.

Diversity of citizenship. (4) This refers to suits under 28 U.S.C. 1332, where parties are citizens of different states. When Box 4 is checked, the citizenship of the different parties must be checked. (See Section III below; **NOTE: federal question actions take precedence over diversity cases.**)

- **III. Residence (citizenship) of Principal Parties.** This section of the JS 44 is to be completed if diversity of citizenship was indicated above. Mark this section for each principal party.
- **IV.** Nature of Suit. Place an "X" in the appropriate box. If the nature of suit cannot be determined, be sure the cause of action, in Section VI below, is sufficient to enable the deputy clerk or the statistical clerk(s) in the Administrative Office to determine the nature of suit. If the cause fits more than one nature of suit, select the most definitive.
- V. Origin. Place an "X" in one of the six boxes.

Original Proceedings. (1) Cases which originate in the United States district courts.

Removed from State Court. (2) Proceedings initiated in state courts may be removed to the district courts under Title 28 U.S.C., Section 1441. When the petition for removal is granted, check this box.

Remanded from Appellate Court. (3) Check this box for cases remanded to the district court for further action. Use the date of remand as the filing date.

Reinstated or Reopened. (4) Check this box for cases reinstated or reopened in the district court. Use the reopening date as the filing date. Transferred from Another District. (5) For cases transferred under Title 28 U.S.C. Section 1404(a). Do not use this for within district transfers or multidistrict litigation transfers.

Multidistrict Litigation. (6) Check this box when a multidistrict case is transferred into the district under authority of Title 28 U.S.C. Section 1407. When this box is checked, do not check (5) above.

- VI. Cause of Action. Report the civil statute directly related to the cause of action and give a brief description of the cause. Do not cite jurisdictional statutes unless diversity. Example: U.S. Civil Statute: 47 USC 553 Brief Description: Unauthorized reception of cable service
- VII. Requested in Complaint. Class Action. Place an "X" in this box if you are filing a class action under Rule 23, F.R.Cv.P. Demand. In this space enter the actual dollar amount being demanded or indicate other demand, such as a preliminary injunction. Jury Demand. Check the appropriate box to indicate whether or not a jury is being demanded.
- VIII. Related Cases. This section of the JS 44 is used to reference related pending cases, if any. If there are related pending cases, insert the docket numbers and the corresponding judge names for such cases.
